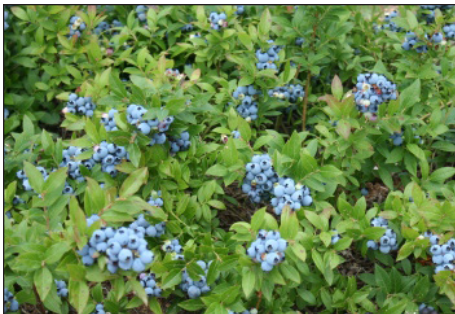


2023 Native Sod Price List

Lawns aren't just for grass anymore! Add some color and texture to your lawn and landscape with the use of native sod. Use ferns, berries and moss, as border plants, rock wall and stairwell accents, or highlight the sod itself by making it the main attraction. Many native sods also work well for erosion control on slopes.

Most native sod is sold by the square foot and each piece measures approximately 16" x 24". However, Cinnamon Fern, Interrupted Fern, and Ostrich Fern are sold by the clump. These are ferns that will spread after planting. Unlike the other native sods, clumps should be planted with space between them, approximately 1 to 2 feet apart. When ordering native sod sold by the clump, calculate one clump for every 2 square feet. Actual size of the clumps will vary.

Minimum orders apply; see individual descriptions. We may be able to reduce the minimum quantity if multiple varieties are being ordered for delivery at the same time. There may be an additional charge for delivery depending on order size and location. Larger orders may be eligible for a discount.



Blueberry | *Vaccinium angustifolium*

approx. 100 sq ft per pallet | Min. order 1 pallet

Maine's famous lowbush wild blueberries! An antioxidant super fruit with four season beauty. In addition to tasty berries, you get perky pink to white bell shaped flowers in May, blazing scarlet color in fall, and red twigs all winter. Full sun and acidic, well-drained soil is preferred. Will need maintenance. Zones 3-7.

Bunchberry | *Cornus canadensis* or *Chamaepericlymenum canadensis*

approx. 150 sq ft per pallet | Min. order 1 pallet

Nothing is more exquisite than this lovely ground cover. Bunchberry grows to three inches tall and slowly spreads. Two-inch whorled leaves, dark green and shiny in summer, become wine-red in the fall. Charming 4-point white flowers from late spring to summer, scarlet berries in the fall. Partial sun/moderate shade, moist soil preferred. Zones 2-6.



Huckleberry | *Gaylussacia baccata*

approx. 150 sq ft per pallet | Min. order 1 pallet

A deciduous shrub often found in dry areas. Grows to about 1-3 feet in height. Huckleberry is a great ground cover for thin, rocky woods. White to pink flowers blossom in the spring, deep black-purple berries arrive in summer, and you'll enjoy an excellent fall display from orange to crimson. Plant in partial shade to full sun; wet, moist, or dry soils will work. Zones 5-9.

Hay-Scented Fern | *Dennstaedtia punctilobula*
approx. 200 sq ft per pallet | Min. order 1 pallet

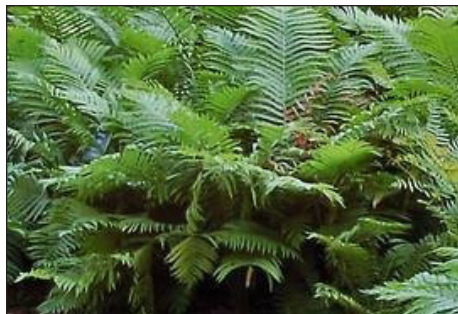

A perfect plant to prevent erosion, hay-scented fern is a very tough, fast spreading, lacy fern. It adapts to drier soil as well as damp soil. Finely textured, it has a fresh spring green color. It's a medium grower to about 15" and is from the bracken fern family. The crushed fronds actually do have the scent of fresh hay! The golden fall color is a bonus. Zones 3-8.

Cinnamon Fern | *Osmundastrum cinnamomeum*
approx. 50 clumps per pallet | Min. order 2 pallets

Always an eye catcher and easily recognized, this big, bold fern can grow up to three feet tall. The unfurling fronds and stems have an appealing, rich, wooly coating as they emerge from the ground in the spring. They grow in moist woodland, bogs, peatlands, thickets, swamps, ditches, and along stream banks. Prefers moderate shade. Zones 1-11. Sold in clumps.



Ostrich Fern | *Matteuccia struthiopteris*
approx. 50 clumps per pallet | Min. order 2 pallets

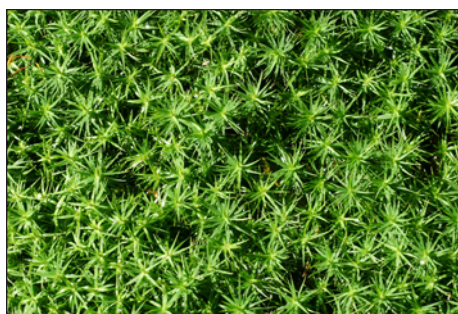

An elegant, symmetrical fern with ostrich feather-like fronds, this vase-shaped fern has broad fronds near the tips and tapers back down to the crown. Plant in filtered sun to full shade. Since this fern likes moist, shaded areas, it's great near wet areas of your landscape. Zones 3-7. Sold in clumps.

Interrupted Fern | *Osmunda claytoniana*
approx. 50 clumps per pallet | Min. order 2 pallets

Interrupted fern gets its name due to the spore bearing leaflets that interrupt the broad fronds of the plant. Grows in a spreading vase form about two to three feet tall, and up to five feet tall with constant moisture. It's deer resistant and performs best in full shade, but can tolerate sun as long as the roots stay moist. Perfect for wet areas of the landscape. Zones 2-8.



Haircap Moss | *Polytrichum commune*
approx. 150 sq ft per pallet | Min. order 1 pallet

In spite of its needle-like appearance, haircap moss is soft to the touch. With no true root system, it requires nothing more than a firm soil bed in a location with adequate shade, acidic soil, and moisture to flourish. Growth of about 1/2" to 3" can be expected. Zones 2-15.
